SERVICE OF TENEBRAE



The word "Maundy" is derived from the Latin "maundatum," which means commandment. It associated with Jesus' words after the last supper, "A new commandment I give unto you, that you love one another..." (John 13:34).

Our service is in the nature of an anniversary observance, held on the night of the institution of Holy Communion. It is brought to a close with the Office of Tenebrae, an adaptation of an early fourth century ritual, dealing with our Lord's betrayal. The gradual extinction of the candles symbolizes the growing darkness as "The Light of the World" was taken away. At the very end of the service of Tenebrae the Pastor relights his candle which is symbolic of the Easter Promise.

Blueberries 'n Cheese Coffeecake

1/2 cup butter
1 1/4 cups granulated sugar
2 eggs
2 1/4 cups flour (divided)
1 tablespoon baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
3/4 cup milk
1/4 cup water
2 cups blueberries
1 8-ounce package Cream Cheese, cubed
1 teaspoon grated lemon peel



<u>Topping</u> 1/4 cup granulated sugar 1/4 cup flour 1 teaspoon grated lemon peel 2 tablespoons butter Powdered sugar

Beat butter and granulated sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, mixing well after each addition. Add combined 2 cups flour, baking powder and salt alternately with combined milk and water, mixing well after each addition. Toss blueberries with remaining flour. Fold blueberries, cream cheese and peel into batter. Pour into greased and floured 13x9-inch baking pan.

Combine granulated sugar, flour and peel; cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Sprinkle over batter. Bake at 375' for 1 hour. Cool. Sprinkle with powdered sugar before serving.

Yield: 12 servings
